Planners tentatively OK 51 homes on Forest Boundary

The Riverside County Planning Commission last month granted a zone change to allow a housing development to be built on about 12 acres of land on Forest Boundary Road across the street from homes in Wildrose Ranch and below homes located in The Retreat. The 3-0 vote was unanimous; two planning commissioners were absent.

The project, although approved by the Planning Commission, now must go before the county's Board of Supervisors for a public hearing. A date has not yet been determined.

Planning Commission approval was given based on two contingencies: 1. The developer would decrease the number of homes constructed from 53 to 51 to enlarge the size of the community's park, and 2. Verification of a security gate easement through The Retreat in case of emergency evacuation.

TRACY DAVIS and **KATHERINE CLINGMAN**, residents opposed to the project, are going door-to-door in Wildrose Ranch to obtain signatures on petitions that will be presented at the Board of Supervisors hearing.

- The size of the sign
- One-sided or two-sided
- Payment for the cost of sign plus taxes, handling, and delivery.

Things to consider when ordering: Order in bulk. Cost per unit goes down. Order and deliver to one address will help save shipping cost or simply drive down and pick up on a week day and save all shipping cost.
